



Information for Year 7 Academic Year 2024/2025

1. What should I do if the local authority has offered a place to my child?

If your child has been offered a place at CCHSG please do not contact CCHSG at this stage. The school will be writing to you within two to three weeks of National Offer Day asking you to complete and return our acceptance form.

If you wish to refuse the place offered, please inform CCHSG and your local Authority.

2. What should I do if my child has not been offered a place at CCHSG?

If you did not get your preferred school, you will be added to the waiting lists of all schools that were ranked higher than the school offered in your application. You will be notified in writing if an offer is available. Essex County Council hold the waiting lists for all schools until 31 August 2024. You will be unable to contact Essex County Council until 22 March 2024 about the position of your child on the waiting list. Details of how to check the waiting list are supplied in your offer email or letter from ECC. CCHSG will be unable to give you any information regarding waiting list positions.

3. Travel

What are the options with transport to school?

Transport is arranged through the CSSE, who administer contract bus passes on certain routes. Current routes, timetables and costs can be found on their website at <https://csse.org.uk/transport/>

For students who don't live in the areas for Consortium Coaches, there are privately run coaches from other areas (including Romford, Dagenham and Rainham). Alternatively, your child can travel to school by train and bus. Please see your local bus companies for further information.

We live a long way from the school and my child must get public transport. What happens if she is late?

If there is an earlier public bus/train that your child can catch, then they will need to do so as students may receive sanctions for being late. However, if they travel by contract bus and this is constantly late then parents need to raise this with the CSSE or the bus company your child is using. Parents may also need to look at an alternative method of getting their child to school as they do not want to miss valuable teaching time.

4. What if I would like to change my choice of school?

Contact the School Admissions team at Essex County Council admissions@essex.gov.uk if you:

- want to apply for a school that you did not apply for originally.
- wish to be added to the waiting lists for a school that you named as a lower preference on your application than the school offered.
- you should not reject the school offer you have until you have secured another place.

5. What is the lowest point score required to gain a place at CCHSG?

This will change each year, dependent on the results attained by all candidates. As a guide only for entry in September 2023 on National Offer Day (1 March 2023) this was between 333-334. The lowest score offered for a place for September 2023 was between 326-327. On National Offer Day (1 March 2024) the cut off score for entry for September 2024 is between 329-330.
