<p>What is natural knowledge of God?</p>	<p>Knowledge of God derived from human reason, observation of the world, and the innate sense of the divine.</p>
<p>Define "innate sense of the divine".</p>	<p>The natural human inclination or awareness of God's existence, present in all individuals.</p>
<p>What is revealed knowledge of God?</p>	<p>Knowledge of God that comes through faith, the Bible, the Church, and ultimately Jesus Christ.</p>
<p>What role does faith play in knowing God?</p>	<p>Faith allows individuals to trust in God's revelation and accept His existence even beyond reason.</p>

What is the "imago Dei"?

The belief that humans are made in the image of God and have an innate capacity to know Him.

What is the significance of creation in knowing God?

The order, beauty, and purpose of creation point to the existence of a divine creator.

Define "grace" in Christian theology.

God's unmerited favour and gift of Himself, enabling humans to know Him.

What is the "Fall"?

The biblical event where humanity became sinful, hindering natural knowledge of God.

What can be known of God through Jesus Christ?

Jesus Christ reveals God's nature, character, and will perfectly.

What is the role of the Bible in revealed knowledge?

The Bible is God's Word, providing guidance and knowledge of His will and character.

What is the "sensus divinitatis"?

John Calvin's concept of an innate sense of God present in all humans.

What is the "teleological argument"?

An argument for God's existence based on the design and purpose evident in nature.

What is the "ontological argument"?

An argument for God's existence based on the concept of God as a perfect being.

What is the "cosmological argument"?

An argument for God's existence based on the need for a first cause of the universe.

What does "general revelation" mean?

God's revelation through nature, history, and human conscience.

What does "special revelation" mean?

God's direct revelation of Himself, for example, through Jesus Christ or Scripture.

What is the role of human reason in knowing God?

Reason helps humans reflect on evidence of God, but it is limited without faith and grace.

What is the "Holy Spirit's" role in knowing God?

The Holy Spirit enables humans to receive God's grace and understand His revelation.

Can God be known through reason alone?

This is debated; many argue reason can suggest God's existence, but faith is needed for full knowledge.
