<p>What was the Wall Street Crash?</p>	<p>The Wall Street Crash of 1929 was a major stock market collapse in the United States that triggered a global economic depression.</p>

What was Article 48?

Article 48 of the Weimar Constitution allowed the President to rule by decree in times of emergency, bypassing the Reichstag.

What was the Nazi Party's vote share in 1930 compared to 1932?
