<p>What was the policy of Vietnamisation?</p>	<p>Vietnamisation was President Nixon's strategy to reduce American involvement in the Vietnam War by training and equipping South Vietnamese forces to take over combat duties.</p>
<p>When did the USA sign the Paris Peace Accords?</p>	<p>The USA signed the Paris Peace Accords in January 1973, marking the beginning of the end of their involvement in Vietnam.</p>
